In addition to identifying appropriate events on which to bid and developing bid packages, the Greater Cincinnati Sports Corporation manages awarded events, negotiates hotel room and transportation packages, secures corporate sponsorships, organizes and operates a large volunteer base, schedules facility usage, coordinates hospitality events and executes event media and community relations plans.

Most important, the Greater Cincinnati Sports Corporation's efforts have far-reaching economic benefits by drawing large numbers of participants and spectators to the Greater Cincinnati region who spend millions of dollars on hotel rooms, in restaurants and at area attractions.

Since its founding in 1987, the non-profit 501c(3) Greater Cincinnati Sports Corporation has enriched our community through the acquisition of more than 150 amateur and professional sporting events and by maximizing the economic impact these events have had on the Greater Cincinnati region.

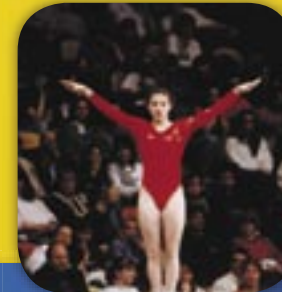

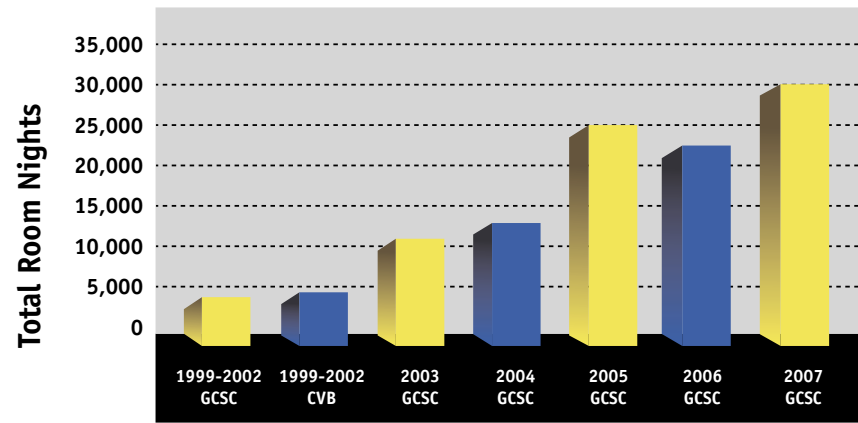

GCSC 5-Year Results Under Current Leadership

- GCSC has been a top producing market for Hamilton County since 2003 booking 23,740 hotel room nights per year.
 - GCSC has booked definite 118,702 total room nights over the past 5 years for a total economic impact of \$30,743,818* for the region.
- *Based on IACVB ROI formula of \$259/room night consumed
- GCSC efforts the past five years have produced more than a 269% increase in sports room night bookings for the region since 1993-2002.

2007–Anthony Muñoz

Anthony Muñoz is one of Cincinnati's true sports icons. Considered by many as the greatest offensive lineman in NFL history, Muñoz has a record of excellence that is unrivaled in professional football. An eleven-time NFL Pro Bowl selection, Muñoz is the only Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee in Cincinnati Bengals history. Since retiring, Anthony and his family have remained in Cincinnati, where Muñoz has served as one of the community's most accessible and involved advocates and also created the Anthony Muñoz Foundation.



2008–Gale Sayers

Pride, poise, leadership, dedication and loyalty are all traits exhibited by NFL Hall of Famer Gale Sayers. Following an incredible football career with the Chicago Bears, Sayers began another successful career in business following the same principles he used on the field. Sayers personally and professionally devotes a great deal of time supporting, fundraising, and speaking on behalf of many organizations. Sayers has authored an instructional publication on the fundamentals of football's offensive strategies called *Offensive Football*. In addition, his autobiography, *I Am Third*, was produced into an award-winning television movie, *Brian's Song*. The movie featured the special personal and professional relationship between Sayers and his cancer-stricken teammate, Brian Piccolo. In October, 2007 a new book was released called, *Gale Sayers, My Life and Times*.

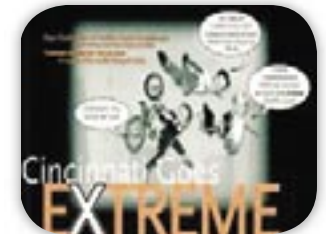
